"Rare Earths in America: What History Tells"

Our speaker has 50 years of experience with industrial minerals and was an early worker in the area of exploration for rare element bearing minerals. This talk will provide an over view of some basic principles of rare earth elements and minerals and the history of their development as well as their importance in many recent technologies upon which we as individuals and our country dependent. The search for Uranium and Thorium opened the door to the search for rare earth bearing minerals. What has happened in the past and what are the US reserves and current state of production?
